Americanism – VC Paul Wackowski

The American Legion's **Be The One** suicide prevention program has remained the organization's top priorty since its creation in April 2022. The program has received worldwide exposure through the Legion's relationship with Chip Ganassi Racing and the NTT INDYCAR. "You all play a realy important role in this because you understand that. Especially men. Men are historicaly bad at asking for help, especialy mental health care.

Many won't talk about their mental health for fear of becoming preceived as broken and jeopardizing their career, as well as worrying about their confidentiality concerns. They feel more comfortable coming to someone that they know and trust, rather than going to a doctor.

When issues pile up, that's when thoughts of suicide begin to manifest.

Those signs can be recognized. "We feel something when something's off". We know when somebody that we have known for a while comes in and they're just different. We know when maybe someone we don't know looks they're having a hard time.

When somebody you know is going through a tough time, it's really important to have a conversation. Also, make sure those firearms are properly secured. Make it more difficult in that moment to access something that a veteran can use to harm themselves.

When attempting to help someone in a moment of crisis or someone talking about suicide: Be there, in the moment, looking the person in the eye. Keep the person in front of you. If you're on the phone, keep them talking and make sure to listen. Make good eye contact. Don't be judgmental. Be open and accepting of what they have to say, even though that means that they don't want to live. Don't be afraid to ask questions directly. Ask if you can call the Veterans Crisis line to connect them with resources. If they don't want to call the crisis line, see if there is someone else they can call to make them feel safe. Its important to build some sort of camaraderie with that person contemplating suicide early in the conversion.

You can do that by showing that you care about them, that you are genuine, that you'll do something when they tell you something. They'll trust you that you'll do the right thing.
