In1781, she enlisted as a male AKA Robert Shurtleff Massachusetts 4th light rifles regiment. She went undetected for over 2 years sustaining multiple injuries in battle, she received a gash on her forehead from a sword and was shot in her left thigh. She extracted the pistol ball herself. Her identity was discovered. Later in Philadelphia, where she became ill and lost consciousness and as discovered it was while being treated. She received an honorable discharge in 1783 she was the only women to earn a full military pension for participation in the revolutionary war

Carbon Monoxide is the leading cause of poisoning in the USA. Unattended cooking is the number 1 cause of cooking fires in the USA. Have a fire extinguisher in your kitchen, garage, and near a fireplace. This is the season for chimney fires. Have them properly cleaned or inspected. Leaving vehicles in garages running to warm up is a cause for carbon monoxide poisoning.
