POW/MIA recognition day is always the 3rd Friday in September. This is to honor all those commitments and sacrifices that were made for our nation and recognize all those missing in action, you are not forgotten. Even with the advances in forensic, we are still recovering the remains of unidentified service people from past wars and conflicts.

Constitution day and citizenship day are combined on the date of September 17th to be observed for the constitution and the citizens of our country because we the people have made laws we live by and need to educate the young on why and how these laws were made

Gold Star Mother day is the last Sunday of the month I will only add that this is an honor no one wants. But we must honor the sacrifices of families to this country. To have given a son or daughter or a member of their family, for this country, is above and beyond, the call to duty. The banner with a blue star indicates a member in the armed forces, the number of stars represents the number of family members in the service. A Gold star represents a service member who was killed while on active duty the number of stars indicates the number of service members killed.

Of Note. The Gold Star Mothers was created in 1928 Grace Darling Seibold who was a founding member with 24 other Gold Star mothers. Who had lost sons in WW 1, met in Washington D.C... One of the most well-known Gold Star mothers is, Aletta Sullivan. She had 5 sons who were all killed after the ship they were on, the USS Juneau, was torpedoed during the battle of Guadalcanal. . in their honor the USS Sullivans was commissioned and is now at Buffalo Naval Park.

The Electronic Bell-Jar (aka: E-Tabs) Resolution that was passed by Erie County, has been added to the 2025 Department Legislative Agenda. The bill has passed both the New York State Assembly and Senate and is currently on Governor Hochul desk.

If signed into law, Posts may be eligible for up to 5 E-Tab Machines with 2 Games loaded on each and may be acquired thru legacy Bell-Jar suppliers on consignment from the Bell-Jar manufacturer for a 65/35 split favoring the Post. E-Tabs machines can be used with existing paper Bell-Jar games. 
